




**Courtesy Shuttles**  
CSU provides an on-demand shuttle service for students between main campus and the University Center for the Arts. Students can book rides through the CSU Shuttle app.

CSU offers a first-come, first-served shuttle service for students with eligible mobility disabilities. Apply through the Student Disability Center to check eligibility. Book rides using the CSU Courtesy Shuttle app.

**ParkMobile**  
Parking in designated hourly parking spaces is made easier with the mobile app. Select the amount of time you want to park in the app and pay directly with a credit card. If you need to park longer, you may extend the time using the app without walking back to your car to pay the hourly pass station. The app is only valid in hourly parking spaces and not valid in permit designated areas.

**Campus Parking**

- CSU Transportation is a self-funded auxiliary department of Colorado State University. No tax revenue, general funds, student fees, or tuition monies are received or used to support parking on campus and the CSU Transportation budget. Paid parking is required on Colorado State University campuses.
- Designated parking areas are signed, striped, or both. Posted signs in parking areas inform users and regulate authorized parking permits in the area. Please visit [colostate.edu/transportation](https://colostate.edu/transportation) for a detailed explanation of parking regulations.
- Parking on campus is monitored through a virtual permit system that scans your license plate. Your license plate is linked to your parking permit. Vehicles parked on campus must have a valid CSU parking permit associated with their properly displayed and clearly visible license plate or pay by the hour in designated hourly parking spaces. All zones are enforced as posted. Please watch signage carefully when entering the parking areas or as designated in the lot.
- Parking in spaces in the interior area of campus may be difficult at times. Please allow sufficient time to walk to your desired destination, or take the free on campus shuttle, Around the Horn.
- Parking areas are enforced over summer, fall, winter, spring, and holiday breaks.
- ADA parking is available with a state issued ADA placard or ADA license plate and valid CSU parking permit or pay to park in an hourly designated space.
- Visitors can purchase daily parking permits online to park in Z, V, or R permitted spaces or pay by the hour to park in designated hourly parking spaces.
- CSU students living on campus in residence halls or apartment housing can purchase permits valid for their designated residence hall or apartment location.
- Aggie Village apartments have limited parking availability. Parking permits are sold by waitlist status only.

- CSU students living off campus can purchase permits to park in Z, V, or R spaces.
- Hourly parking is available on campus for staff, students, and visitors. Payment can be made using the mobile app or at pay stations in the lot. CSU parking permits are not valid in hourly parking spaces.
- CSU parking permits are not valid during home football games and Residence Hall students are required to repark to designated parking areas.
- CSU electric vehicle chargers are available on the Main, South and Foothills Campus, a Chargepoint account and valid payment are required, see signage at the spaces for payment requirements. Vehicles may charge for up to 4 hours and must be actively charging while parked in an EV space.

- CSU parking regulations are approved by the Board of Governors in accordance with the authority of Colo. Rev. Stat. §§ 23-5-106 through 108.



**Transportation Around Campus**

- Around the Horn, free campus shuttle, runs every 10-20 minutes during the school year and every 20 minutes during summer, winter, and spring break. Visit [ridetransfort.com/routes/horn](https://ridetransfort.com/routes/horn) for schedule and stops.
- Transfort routes are free to CSU students, employees, and visitors. Visit [RideTransfort.com](https://ridetransfort.com) for updated routes and schedules.
- Travel by bicycle, scooter, skateboard, and by foot are supported on campus by mode specific pathways. More than 18,000 parking spaces are available for bikes, scooters, and skateboards.

**Regulation of Moving Vehicles**

- In application of City and State Codes: Relevant Fort Collins municipal and Colorado traffic laws pertaining to the regulation, control, and enforcement of moving vehicular traffic are enforced on campus streets at all times. Each individual operating a motor vehicle on University property must obey all parking and traffic controls, signs, and lights.
